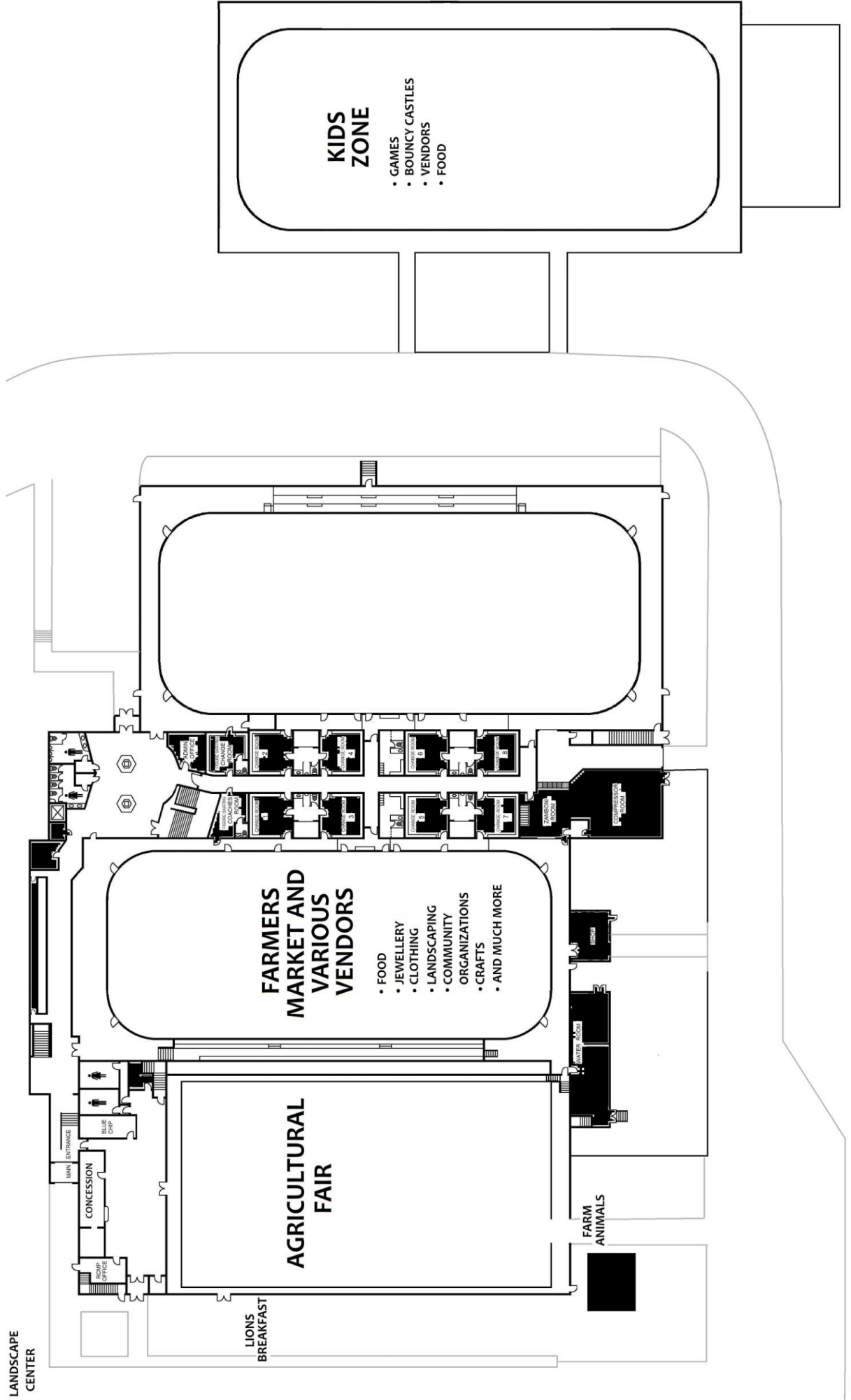

## General Rules & Etiquette

Please Note: There have been many changes in the book. Read all sections **carefully!**  
New classes have been italicized.

1. **Entry Fee:** 25 cents per entry. **All ages allowed two entries per class number, except where specified.** Individual entries must be made in person. For certain classes, one item can be entered in 2 categories (counts as 2 entries)
2. **Exhibit Registration Times:**
  - Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup>, 6pm-9pm- **All Arts, Crafts and Hobbies entries must be brought in at this time (Horticulture and Cooking also accepted)**
  - Friday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, 2:30pm-6:00pm, **Only Horticulture and Cooking entries will be accepted. Doors will be closed at 6:00pm sharp.**
  - Judging will begin at 7:00pm. The Show will be open for viewing at 9am on Saturday, September 10<sup>th</sup>.
3. **Location:** All entries must be delivered to the Springbank Park for All Seasons curling arena.
4. **Registration Number:** All entrants will receive a registration number to be used on all entry tags along with the entrant's name. Please pick up your tags and registration number ahead of time from the SPFAS.
5. **Entry Tags:** Available to be picked up from the SPFAS office starting August 8<sup>th</sup>, Monday to Friday from 9am to 3pm. Call 403-242-2223 for information and catalogues. Exhibitors entering more than 5 entries are requested to obtain their entry tags beforehand and have them completed prior to registration. Children's entry tags must be labeled with the correct age category. **All entry tags will be paid for at pick up. Any unused tags will be reimbursed.**
6. **Ownership:** All entries must be the work of the exhibitor, and must not have been shown in previous SPFAS Agricultural Fairs.
7. **Judging:** Containers do not count in judging unless one is specified. Note carefully the number of articles called for and any other particulars given for each class as errors may disqualify the entry. In all cases, the judge's decision is final. Classes may be set up at the discretion of the judges or a class may be subdivided if there are numerous entries. The Danish system of judging is used in this competition. In this system, coloured ribbons are used to indicate the placing in the competition. Each entry is judged against a standard and is given a rating. Each entry will receive points and a placement ribbon. One first, second and third placing will be awarded per class. All judge's decisions are final.

Cash prizes will be awarded to the winner of each category and sub-category (not individual class numbers). Ribbons are awarded in each class number. Trophies are awarded on the basis of a total point system for each category- **Red ribbon (1<sup>st</sup> place)=3 points, Blue ribbon (2<sup>nd</sup> place)=2 points, White ribbon (3<sup>rd</sup> place)=1 point.**

It is the prize winners responsibility to pick up their awarded prize the day of the Fair (unless other arrangements have previously been made). Any unclaimed prizes will be used in the next years fair.
8. **Disclaimer:** Neither the Fall Fair Organizing Committee nor the Springbank Park for All Seasons Agricultural Society is responsible for any loss; damage or injury of any nature to property while it is on exhibit. The committee shall take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of all articles.
9. **Removal of Entries:** Entries may not be removed from the display **until after the awards presentation on Saturday afternoon.** Any articles remaining unclaimed become the property of the Show Committee.
10. The SPFAS Fair Committee would be pleased to recycle ribbons. Please bring in any previous years ribbons to registration.

#### The "ideal" Baking Powder Biscuit

- has a fairly smooth surface
- is delicately browned
- has a tender-crisp crust with a slightly moist interior
- is flaky and tender
- has a pleasant flavor

#### The "ideal" loaf of yeast bread

- has a smooth rounded top
- is evenly browned
- has a thin crust and moist interior
- has a fine, even interior texture
- is light
- has a pleasant taste and aroma

#### The "ideal" cake and cupcake

- has a flat or slightly rounded top
- has a moist, fine grained, slightly glossy surface
- has a fine, velvety texture
- has small cells throughout the cupcake
- does not crumble significantly when cut
- is tender
- has characteristic, pleasant flavor

#### The "ideal" pie crust

- has tiny blisters
- is very delicately browned
- is tender and flaky
- has a pleasant, bland flavor which does not interfere with the flavor of the filling

**Lazy Daisy Cake**

Recipe taken from the 1954 Springbank UCW Cookbook  
Submitted By Terry Ona

| 2 eggs         | 1 cup flour          |
| 1 cup sugar    | 1 tsp. baking powder |
| ½ cup milk     | 1 tsp. vanilla       |
| 1 tbsp. butter | pinch of salt        |
- Heat milk and butter, Beat eggs, add sugar, beating well. Stir in dry ingredients. Add vanilla and carefully stir in hot milk and butter. Batter is very thin. Bake in shallow pan (9" square pan) for 25 mins at 350 degrees F.
- After baking, cover the top with the following: Combine 2/3 cup brown sugar, 1/3 cup melted butter, 1 cup coconut, 4 tbsp. cream. Spread on top of baked cake and put under broiler until brown and bubbly.  
(Leave cake in pan to exhibit)

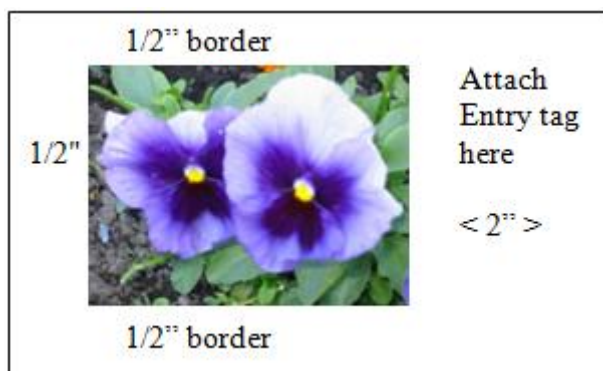

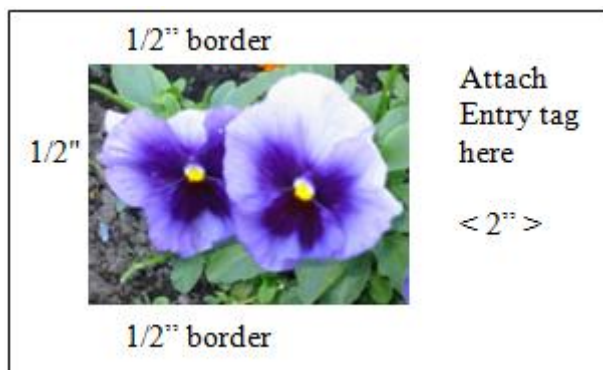

2 eggs	1 cup flour
1 cup sugar	1 tsp. baking powder
½ cup milk	1 tsp. vanilla
1 tbsp. butter	pinch of salt

Heat milk and butter, Beat eggs, add sugar, beating well. Stir in dry ingredients. Add vanilla and carefully stir in hot milk and butter. Batter is very

thin. Bake in shallow pan (9" square pan) for 25 mins at 350 degrees F.

After baking, cover the top with the following: Combine 2/3 cup brown sugar, 1/3 cup melted butter, 1 cup coconut, 4 tbsp. cream. Spread on top of baked cake and put under broiler until brown and bubbly.

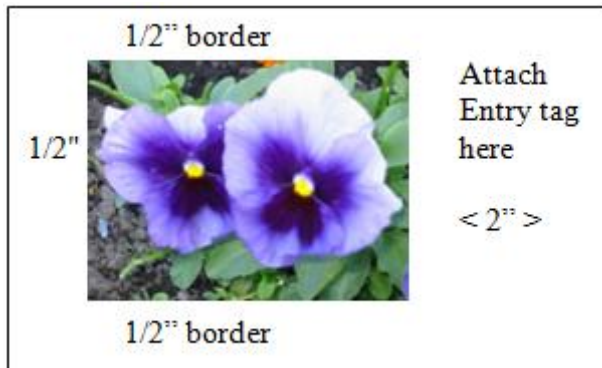
